Call for Papers: Nordic Book on Pynchon

Anne Mangen (Lecturer, Department of Library and Documentation Science and Department of Comparative Literature, the University of Tromsø, Norway) and Rolf Gaasland (Associate Professor, Department of Comparative Literature, the University of Tromsø) are writing an introductory book on Thomas Pynchon, featuring essays on his novels and short stories. The book will be the first such presentation of Pynchon ever published in the Nordic countries, and will be of utmost importance considering that both *V.* and *Mason & Dixon* are about to be published in Norwegian translation (to join the Norwegian *Lot 49* and a growing list of translations into Danish, Swedish and Finnish). We intend our presentation of this important and extremely interesting author primarily for students (graduate and post-graduate level) and other scholars.

We welcome manuscripts in English on the Pynconomy in the U.S. to consider for possible inclusion in the collection. Relevant topics could be a historical sketch of research activity on Pynchon, an account of the Pynconomy today—anything that could be of interest to students, scholars and others not previously familiar with Pynchon's texts or his position in the field of American literature.

Our tentative plan is to have the articles ready by March 2000, depending on contributors, publisher, etc.
